Neighbourhood Watch

There are two Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) Schemes active in Whixall:

- Hollinwood, Sandy Bank, Stanley Green and Welsh End Scheme (Whixall North East) has 63 members and is coordinated by Graham Turnbull (01948 880856).
- Waterloo has approximately 20 members and is run by Rita Welch (01939 234243)

All members receive a monthly newsletter which provides local NHW news, West Mercia Police information, North Shropshire area incident reports plus home security and safety guidance briefs. We also arrange for regular visits to the village by the Whitchurch Police Safer Neighbourhood Team.

Why join our NHW scheme?

Due to the size of the parish there are still several areas of Whixall that are not covered by the Scheme which aims to:

- Prevent crime and the opportunities for crime and anti-social behaviour.
- Reassure local residents and reduce the fear of crime and antisocial behavior
- Reduce the incidence of domestic fires and environmental damage to residential property.

 Encourage neighbourliness and community cohesion



 Improve the quality of life for local residents and tenants.

It does this by being a community-based organisation with residents and tenants working together, sharing information and working in partnership with the police and other agencies to prevent crime and disorder, anti-social behaviour and the risk of fire and environmental damage.

NHW works best when you and your neighbours are all part of the scheme – then you can look out for each other and your part of the village. If you are interested in joining the NHW scheme then please contact the Whixall lead coordinator, Graham Turnbull, for details. We can expand the scheme into your area. Membership costs only £2 per annum.

Whixall Marl Allotment (The Marlot)

The Marlot is an area of common land of about 6 acres, situated alongside the canal at Roundthorn Bridge. Under the stewardship of the Parish Council, it is managed as a wildlife site and maintained by volunteers.

Cattle were introduced in early October to try to keep the grass and regenerated willow growth under control. A team of volunteers carries out year-round work including cutting back the overgrowth in the pond and meadow areas and dealing with fallen or damaged tree branches. This ongoing work often carried out with hand tools, despite the dense vegetation which returns year after year. Ditch maintenance work will be required this winter.

There is a great sense of achievement and satisfaction among the volunteers, knowing that their work helps the survival of wildlife. Without the support and guidance of Natural England staff and volunteers, the current small local band would struggle to cope and so we are looking for more volunteers from the local community.
