You may remember an article in our last newsletter about a project to bring superfast broadband to Shropshire.

Connecting Shropshire aims to ensure that every household and business will have access to the industry-standard level of broadband, with as many properties as possible having access to a superfast broadband service, by the end of 2015.

The Government has ploughed £8.2 million into the Connecting Shropshire project, with the same amount being invested by Shropshire Council.

It is absolutely crucial that as many people and businesses as possible **register their interest**, because we need to show potential investors that Shropshire communities and businesses want superfast broadband.

You can show your support by registering your details by clicking on the link on the

Chairman's report

Firstly, I wish to express sincere gratitude to Mr Graham Murphy for all his hard work as a Whixall Parish Councillor who resigned in January having moved away from the area.

Secondly, I would like to welcome two new Councillors: Dr Jeremy Phillips and Ms Di McNeish. We hope that they enjoy the experience of being members of the Parish Council.

Two new notice boards have been erected in the Parish; one at the Social Centre and the other at Moss Villas aka Moss Cottages. The notice boards will be used to display various notices such as the Council's meeting schedule, Councillors contact details and meeting agendas.

With regard to the Council's financial matters; I can confirm that the accounts for the year ending 31st March 2012 have been presented for internal audit and following inspection will be sent to the external auditors Mazars. There will be an opportunity for members of the public to inspect the accounts which will be the advertised on aforementioned Parish Council notice boards.

The Council have recently donated £400 towards a new cycle shelter at Whixall

School and have also offered to make a contribution towards a proposed 'picnic and play' area at the school site which the whole community can benefit from.

<u>'Your Natural Heritage' Project-</u> Restoring Whixall Marlot (The Marl Allotment)

Last Summer the **Whixall Natural Heritage group** was begun under the leadership of Dr Gareth Parry from Shropshire Council's Natural Environment Team. Within the project there is funding available for local habitat management.

In our parish we have a plot of common land known locally as the Marlot which in the past was used for the extraction of marl (rock or soil consisting of clay and lime). The site is situated next to the Llangollen canal at Roundthorn Bridge.

The Marlot has been home to a range of interesting flora and fauna as recorded previously but in recent years the site has been degrading due to a lack of resources for management. It had become overgrown, the pools were slowly drying out and many of the open habitats had been lost.

Our local survey group and the Parish Council asked for funding for regeneration of the plot and the application was approved. With the help of some match funding from Natural England an extensive restoration plan has been undertaken to restore the mosaic of habitats, clear paths and install bat and bird boxes. The work has created a network of pools that were immediately inhabited by breeding frogs.
